Gate vandalism

Recently we have twice experienced vandalism to the gates at a cost of £350 a time to repair. Recycling

We are advised from time to time that the amount of waste that could be recycled but is in fact put in with the household waste is too high. To that end the RBWM have delivered clear sacks for recycled waste which can be put in the recycled bins (black with red lid or purple). The bin with a black lid is for household waste only. We also now have three purpose built compost areas behind the two sheds at the end of the riverside footpath for use by those who wish to recycle green/food waste. Please do use them but in accordance with the guidelines thereon.

We are lucky to have a purpose made barbeque next to 'the hard' which the Board would encourage everyone to use. We would however ask that if you do, you bear in mind that others will want to too. So please leave it the way you would like to find it and remove old coals etc, rather than leave it for someone else.

Equally we have cushions for all the chairs on the Hard which are kept in the chest by the BBQ. These are for everyone to use. We simply ask that these are put back when you are finished to protect them from the weather etc. Thank you.

We all know the geese create a mess not only on 'the hard' but on the grass. We can never stop this but we can help prevent it by never feeding the geese (ducks and swans only) and under no circumstances feeding any wildlife in the grounds only in the river.
